Rev. Ryan Althaus is the San Jose Presbyterian Hunger and Inclusivity advocate and leader of Sweaty Sheep — a local ministry rooted in the utilization of recreation as a means of uniting our diverse community of faiths, abilities, and labels. Ryan is also an advocate of mental health awareness and destigmatization, and this passion has motivated his management of a 14-person sobriety home in Santa Cruz. Additionally, he hosts a bi-weekly radio show, "The Kooky Side of Crazy," Thursday evenings on KSQD 90.7FM. Known affectionately as Captain Mango among his salty sailing fellowship, Ryan is also the Minister of Interfaith Relations of the Santa Cruz Unitarian Fellowship and an active board member of the National Presbyterians Disability Inclusion Network. 
