Special Call to Action & Prayer (Abbreviated for this newsletter)

Dear Members and Friends of the Presbytery of San José,

[On] Thursday, January 22nd, I will join the leaders and members of Gilroy Presbyterian Church as we accompany one of their congregants, Mathias, to the ICE field office in downtown San Francisco at 630 Sansome Street. Mathias is a legal asylum seeker from Cameroon and has been an active worshipper at Gilroy Pres. Our siblings in the faith at Gilroy Pres have overwhelmed Mathias with their expressions of love and support, contributing towards his legal defense, and, this past Sunday, tearfully laid hands upon him in prayer. His attorney advises that there is a high likelihood that he may be apprehended tomorrow and eventually deported.

We as a faith community who follow the life and ways of Jesus Christ are called to not only consider refugees among us as citizens, but to love them as ourselves (Leviticus 19:33-34, Deuteronomy 10:19). In fact, the Lord Christ equates and connects caring for and loving the vulnerable among us as caring and loving Himself (Matthew 25:35-36). We have a moral imperative and as an act of faithful discipleship, to care and love, not an abstract human being or the concept of "humanity," but actual real people. Mathias is one among so many in our communities, nation, and world who are experiencing the real consequences of policies that are striking fear in the lives of people.

If you cannot join us in person, please hold Mathias in prayer, his attorney, as well as ICE officials who will process his case. We pray the Holy Spirit of freedom and love will surround Mathias with peace, and will work in the hearts and minds of ICE officials to allow him to remain in the United States and grant him the asylum he seeks, as his home country of Cameroon is in the midst of a yearslong civil war.

Whether here in northern California, in Minneapolis, or in many places around the world, let us be in fervent prayer to the Lord our God, whose call to love neighbor and stranger, to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God becomes ever more salient with every passing day.

In the spirit of the theme, “Stamping out Racism” you can have your paper money stamped at the library with a “resist” or other icons we will provide later.

Yes, stamping paper money is generally legal in the U.S. as long as you don't intend to defraud, destroy the bill, or use it for advertising, which would violate laws against defacing currency (18 U.S.C. § 333) or creating likenesses for commercial use (18 U.S.C. § 475). Messages for political speech, like those from the Stamp Stampede, are often protected by First Amendment expression. However, banks and businesses can still refuse to *accept stamped or marked bills*.
