COPA stands for "Communities Organized for Relational Power in Action."

Building relational power to improve our communities is what we are about.

This year COPA had house meetings with more than 800 people across Monterey and Santa Cruz counties allowing us to hear from families about the challenges they face in their everyday lives.



When the Governor proposed catastrophic cuts to Medi-Cal for immigrants, COPA mobilized more than 100 local leaders to go to Sacramento and speak face-to-face with our legislators about the devastating impact this would have on families in our community. We are proud that we played a part in rescinding many of these cuts.

In Santa Cruz, COPA leaders and Clergy got out the vote, submitted letters to the editor and educated their institutions in support of Measure C which will raise ~9 million annually for affordable housing in Santa Cruz. It passed with 53% of the vote!

The work of building relational power, developing leaders, and creating the just community we want to live in will continue in the new year. COPA trains and develops the next generation of leaders to make Monterey Bay a better place for families.


